NIOSH study on Long-haul Trucking

National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) published a study on safety issues facing long-haul truckers in the journal Accident Analysis and Prevention. The data came from a survey conducted by NIOSH in 2010 interviewing 1,265 long-haul truck drivers at 32 truck stops across the continental U.S. You can find key findings and a link to the article on the NIOSH website.

The webpage addresses this issue by providing hospital administrators with information on the risk factors, associated costs and actions that can be taken to manage the problem.

'Trench Right' App

The Michigan Infrastructure and Transportation Association has sponsored the creation of an app to perform calculations on excavations to determine if they are safe enough to complete. The App uses dimensions, soil type and tons-per-square-foot as inputs, and uses that data to determine if a work site is safe. The free app is available from the Google Play Store and the Apple Store.

Roadway Congestion

If you think it's getting busier on the roads, you're right. The U.S. Department of Transportation's (USDOT) Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)reported that October 2015 set a record for the number of miles driven during the month. Flavoring Chemicals in E-Cigarettes Linked to Severe Respiratory Disease

Researchers have found a flavoring chemical linked to severe respiratory disease in food manufacturing workers in some flavored electronic cigarettes. This paper in the journal Environmental Health Perspectives found the chemical diacetyl in 47 of 51 flavored e-cigarettes. The paper urges further evaluation of these products due to the relationship between diacetyl and bronchiolitis obliterans and other severe respiratory diseases observed in workers.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics created two interactive online charts illustrating the non-fatal occupational injuries and illnesses that required days away from work in 2014. Check them out at the BLS website.

Back Seat? Buckle Up!

<u>This report</u> from the Governors Highway Safety Association shows nearly 1,000 people killed in motor vehicle crashes while in the back seat in 2013 were unrestrained. The report concludes that increasing rear seat belt use is a quick, easy and inexpensive way to save lives.
