# The third BILLION back

*Ohio Workers' Comp Rebates* 

Ohio's economy will get a big boost in July. That's when BWC will send \$1 billion in rebates to eligible Ohio employers, the first part of The Third Billion Back plan that was announced in March.

Eligible employers will receive checks that total 66 percent of their premiums for the policy year that ended June 30, 2016 (calendar year 2015 for public employers). Private employers who participate in a Group Retrospective rating program will receive their rebates in the fall.

June is National Safety Month, an annual campaign by the <u>National Safety Council</u> to promote the importance of safety to reduce injuries and deaths in the workplace, on the road, at home and in the community.

BWC is proud to support National Safety Month as part of our year-long commitment to creating a culture of safety in Ohio's workplaces. Please join us by redoubling your own efforts to make your workplaces as safe as they can be.

Need help? We've got you covered. BWC's Division of Safety and Hygiene is staffed with experts in occupational safety and hygiene who manage programming designed to prevent accidents and injuries in Ohio workplaces. Services are free to most employers with a workers' compensation policy and include <u>education and training</u>, field consultation services, safety grants, safety councils, the annual <u>Safety Congress and Expo</u>, and a <u>specialized</u> <u>library</u>.

Ohio is already seeing fewer injuries. The most recent data available shows Ohio had 2.9 injuries per 100 workers compared to the national average of 3.3. (Calendar Year 2015). That zero point four percent means Ohio has nearly 17,000 more people returning home safe to their loved ones after their shift each day than if we were just performing at the national average. Let's rally together to bring those numbers down even more. <u>Our safety experts are ready to work with you</u>.
